

HIDDEN HISTORY

The Michael P. and Lyle C. Williams Library Collection in Ethics in Business and Society was established in 1984. The collection is the fifth endowed University collection at Notre Dame and was funded by **Robert J. "Bud" Williams** ('49) in memory of his parents. Although Bud Williams' father Michael never graduated from high school, he was a strong believer in higher education.

The Williams Collection focuses on the ethical aspects of business and how it relates to sociology, religion and government. Some of the materials funded by the endowment include a number of Public Broadcasting Service videos about questionable business practices and the savings and loan controversy. It also provides access to journals such as Business Ethics:



MENDOZA IN THE NEWS

STUDY PARTICIPANTS NEEDED

Notre Dame faculty, staff and students have the opportunity to participate in a federally funded project about the social transmission and evasion of COVID-19, which is being undertaken by ITAO's **Corey Angst** in collaboration with ND's computer science faculty.

For the pilot program, which runs through mid-June 2021, participants will be asked to carry small, wireless devices called proximity beacons with them when they are on campus. (Note: The beacons are NOT tracking devices nor do they register any information about the identity of the carrier. They simply calculate distance between other people carrying beacons and stationary beacons in specific locations on campus.)

If you'd like to take part in this study, email Corey at <u>cangst@nd.edu</u> and he will drop a beacon in your Mendoza mailbox. Beacons also will be available for pickup near the mailboxes in the Faculty Support Office. Anyone who works at or attends ND is eligible. Participants will receive a \$10 gift card (a debit card) that can be used anywhere debit cards are accepted. You MUST have a smartphone in order to download an app in order to consent to the study and receive the gift card.

There is no requirement regarding the frequency with which you come to campus; however, for the pilot study, the researchers will get better data the more you are on campus. If the pilot is successful and they are able to monitor proximities, they will launch a much larger study in fall 2021. If you will be back on campus in the fall, please hold on to your beacon after the pilot ends. Corey will contact you again and offer another incentive for participation.
