Bountiful Winter Session offerings reflect successful integration within Mendoza Graduate Programs

the faculty and staff in Mendoza Graduate Programs to create learning opportunities for Specialized Master's students during the months between the fall and spring semesters. Topics include DE&I in the Workplace, Effective Communication, Emotional Intelligence and Spiritual Leadership Communication Bootcamp: Presented by colleagues in the Fanning Center for Business Communication, this bootcamp will ask students to commit six hours to taking their

Sessions will target skills critical to the job search process and are open to all Mendoza Graduate Programs. • For-credit courses: Optional, for-credit courses will be offered in Nonprofit Management & Leading with Social Impact, Board Relations & Management, and Special Topics in Tax.
