

HIDDEN HISTORY

In 1954, a 30-hour master's program was established at the College by Rev. Theodore M. Hesburgh, C.S.C., to serve men and women from Catholic religious orders who needed graduate work in business or who held administrative positions with hospitals, colleges and other institutions. Originally called the Master of Business Administration program, it is the oldest graduate program at Notre Dame.

When the College launched its two-year MBA program in 1967, the original program was renamed the Master of Science in Institutional Administration, which was later shortened to Master of Science in Administration.

In 2005, the non-residential program was renamed the Master of Nonprofit



Administration (MNA) program. The change was made to better reflect the primary purpose of the program - to prepare participants for leadership roles in nonprofit organizations, including social service, various religious ministries, education and the arts. In 2019, the College welcomed its first residential MNA cohort of early-career students, and the non-

residential program for working professionals became known as the Executive MNA. "Hidden History" celebrates the series of people, moments and events that collectively constitute 100




